Report on One Day Seminar

Lepcha, Limbu and Bhutia: Cultural Discourse, Organized by Sikkim University, Yangang Campus on 24.03.2025

On 24th March 20205, the Departments of Lepcha, Limbu and Bhutia of Sikkim University held a One-day Seminar named Lepcha, Limbu and Bhutia (LLB): Cultural Discourse at the Permanent Campus, Yangang. Smt. Raj Kumari Thapa, the Hon'ble Deputy Speaker of the Sikkim Legislative Assembly and Area MLA of the Rangang-Yangang constituency served as the Chief Guest. Prof. Dr. Jyoti Prakash Tamang, Vice-Chancellor of Sikkim University, graced the seminar as the Guest of Honor. The event also featured the presence of Registrar (In-Charge) Prof. Laxuman Sharma and Dean of the School of Languages and Literature, Prof. Rosy Chamling. The distinguished Resource Persons for the seminar included Padmashri Hildamit Lepcha, Padmashri Jordan Lepcha, Shri Sonam Gyatso Dokhampa, Shri Pem Tshering Bhutia, Shri Aita Khajum, and Shri S. R. The third speaker was Shri Aita Khajum, who addressed the origin of significance within the Limbu Chevabrung/Ke and its Community. At the conclusion, the Chairperson briefly summarized the topics presented by the speakers, and the session ended with a question and answer segment.
