Laboratory: The laboratories in the various departments of the university have state-of-the-art provisions suitably designed for carrying out curriculum-based experiments and various research initiatives. Exhaustive use of such provisions demands periodic maintenance to be carried out. In the annual budget drawn and drafted for the university, a certain amount of capital grant is earmarked as expenditure for the maintenance and overhauling of laboratory equipment and computer systems. The laboratories in the university have a wide variety of equiptment with diverse price range. In case of expensive laboratory instruments, maintenance is carried out on case to case basis and for computer systems and generic systems, Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) is established for maintenance ease. Almost all of our high-end instruments are in the process of being enlisted in the **SIL** portal and made available for various stakeholders. A well-designed set of sequenced actions is stipulated to keep stock of instruments and their utilization by all the departments of the university.

Library: The library is an integral part of the university. Annually certain amount of capital grant is earmarked based on the temporal requirements of the library. The university library is not only accessible to the university faculty, students and staff, but also to faculty and student fraternity of the affiliated colleges as well as the local community.

Sports complex: Presently our university is functioning from rented premises because of which the university does not yet have any dedicated sports complex. Nevertheless, university has constituted a sports committee to manage sports and cultural activities of the university which are held at public sport facilities. University provides necessary grants for the conduct of the sport and cultural events on an annual basis for promoting holistic growth and well-being of the students and staff as well as to inspire talented members among them.

Computers: The overall computational asset of the university is distributed over various academic departments, laboratories, libraries and administrative sections. Necessary clauses are incorporated in the purchase order to meet up to the initial maintenance requirements in terms of warranty agreements. Henceforth, immediately after the expiry of the warranty agreement, the items are placed under the Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) for the said period. In the situation of system breakdown, the custodian of the asset is required to inform the AMC vendors regarding the same and request for arranging for the said maintenance as per the stipulated agreement with the university.

Classrooms: All the 32 departments of the university are operational from rented premises, for facilitating general maintenance needful clauses have been incorporated in the rental agreements signed with the owners of the premises for periodical maintenance work as and when requested. The cost incurred in maintenance related to electrical overhauling is entirely borne by the university.

CRITERION VI – GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT

6.1 Institutional Vision and Leadership

6.1.1 Mention two practices of decentralization and participative management during the last year (maximum 500 words)

The success and prosperity of any educational institute rest on two strong pillars namely, academics and administration. A well-crafted balance is to be maintained between these two pillars for sound operation and delivery of the proposed institutional vision.

There are 32 academic departments in the university. Every department has a set of committees for managing its affairs such as the departmental purchase committee, departmental research committee, departmental curriculum drafting committee and departmental board of studies to name a few. Every committee has a well-defined set of roles and responsibilities as per the university ordinances and regulations. The nominated departmental head presides over the various activities of the committees. She/he acts as a nodal officer between the department and other institutional sections.

The 32 departments are placed under 6 different schools of studies, namely, the School of Human Sciences, School of Languages and Literature, School of Life Sciences, School of Physical Sciences, School of Professional Studies and School of Social Sciences. Each of these schools is headed by a Dean. The departmental head is required to coordinate with the Dean of the respective school for any academic matters. The Dean of the school periodically hosts the school board meeting. The school board has members from all the departments of the school and eminent academicians from other universities. It also has members from other schools of studies in the university. All the recommendations of the departmental board of studies are elaborately discussed in these meetings and appropriate decisions are taken. The proceedings of all the school board's meeting are then presented before the academic council of the university, for consideration, deliberation and needful approval. The academic council is constituted with the Vice-Chancellor as the Chair, the Registrar, the Librarian, the Controller of Examinations, heads of all the departments, academic deans, dean of student Welfares, esteemed members from other universities and representatives for SUSA, SUNTA and SUTA.

The overall administration of the university is monitored and coordinated by Executive Council (EC), Finance Committee (FC), University Court and other committees/cells/positions (such as Anti-Discrimination Officer, Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC), Grievance Redressal Cell, Institutional Bio-safety Committee (IBSC), Internal Complaints Committee (ICC), Institutional Ethical Committee (IEC), Institution Innovation Council (IIC), Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Internal Audit Officer (IAO), Liaison Officer, Official Language Implementation Committee, Samadhan).

The EC is responsible for the conduct of all administrative affairs related to the management and administration of the University. Some of the notable responsibilities are the creation of teaching positions (number and emoluments), creating administrative, ministerial and other necessary posts, appointment to the various posts on the recommendation of the Selection Committee, regulating and enforcing discipline among employees and managing and regulating the finances, accounts, investments, property, business and all other administrative affairs of the University.

The annual accounts and the financial estimates of the University prepared by the Finance Officer shall be laid before the Finance Committee for consideration and comments and thereafter submitted to the Executive Council for approval. The Finance Committee shall recommend limits for the total recurring expenditure for the year, based on the income and resources of the University. At an annual meeting of the court, a report on the working of the University during the previous year, together with a statement of the receipts and expenditure, the balance sheet as audited, and the financial estimate for the next year shall be presented. A copy of the statement of receipts and expenditure, the balance sheet and the financial estimates shall be sent to every member of the Court at least seven days before the date of the annual meeting.

6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (with in 100 words each):

Curriculum Development

The curriculum of the various programs is routinely reviewed and improved in order to establish a clean and skillfully crafted balance between the discipline-specific knowledge required and the most recent trends and advancements. The assistance of numerous committees, including the curriculum development committee, departmental board of studies, school board, and academic council, is employed to carry out this complicated exercise.

The responsible department, connected colleges, subject matter experts from prestigious universities, and business professionals are invited to join the curriculum planning committee. On the advice of the departmental board of studies, school board, and academic council, the proposed curriculum is then presented to the academic council for approval and implementation.

Teaching and Learning

A number of measures have been introduced or put into practice in order to improve the University's Teaching and Learning outcomes. Different departments in the university organized a number of seminars/ workshops inviting renowned national and international academicians and industrial experts to improve the teaching-learning capabilities for the benefit of students as well as younger faculty members, adjunct/guest faculty with extensive academic experience and accomplishments were appointed in different departments.

Examination and Evaluation

The Examination section of the University successfully conducted all pre and post examination works pertaining to all 17 affiliated colleges and 32 University departments and declared timely results. Dissertation evaluation, viva-voce and subsequent result declaration was successfully conducted for MPhil & PhD scholars. The Examination section successfully undertook various works for the 5th Convocation 2019 namely preparation and distribution of degree certificates and medals for all students passing in the years 2017, 2018 and 2019 and processing of convocation applications and fees. Registration was successfully performed for all new students (2019 admissions) of both affiliated colleges and university departments. Provision for online payment of registration fees was made available to the students. The The Examination section streamlined the examination process for newly introduced course M.A in Tibetan and Buddhist Studies at Namgyal Institute of Tibetology and examinations were successfully conducted for the same. It has also initiated the process to streamline examination for newly introduced programme Bachelor of Sowa Rigpa (Tibetan Medicine). The 5th Convocation of the University was held on 3rd November 2019 for three batches 2017, 2018 and 2019.

✤ Research and Development

The output from research initiatives has continually improved across various departments across different schools. The university has a mechanism in place to offer grants for research in the form of specific projects in a highly competitive manner. The University also offers incentives in the form of best publication awards for each school to faculty members who publish works of high impact. The publication record has been steadily improving as a result of these motivating initiatives.

✤ Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation

During the year 2019-20 library has been actively engaged not only on procurement of resources, but also has given due emphasis on promotion of usages. Advertising resources and conducting various user awareness programmes were the priority areas during the year. Added 1016 printed books, 24 e-Books, 62 Journals, 24 Encyclopedias in e-version covering various disciplines including more than 47 PhD and MPhil Theses and Dissertations submitted by the students of Sikkim University. Most of the library budget was utilized for subscription of journals. Among the important databases have been full-text e-journals on Management, Tourism & Hospitality, Education, Chinese Literature, Psychology.

In addition to subscribing some printed core journals in different disciplines, library has been availing the resources of INFLIBNET, DelCon consortium and National Digital Library. Total collection of the library reached 48898.

The university is operational from 112 classrooms and 25 laboratories across 32 academic departments with 4 seminar Halls. All the classrooms are equipped with LCD, Wi-Fi networking facilities.

✤ Human Resource Management

The university has 165 members in the faculty (full time) across 32 academic departments and 118 administrative staff for managing the administrative affairs of the university. Regular interviews are scheduled to fill the vacant position both in teaching and non-teaching cadres. The 118 administrative staff are located in academic departments as well as administrative sections. Human resource management is performed by the establishment section of the university.

Industry Interaction / Collaboration

Various departments such as Horticulture, Computer Applications, Management, Mass Communication have a mechanism in place to organise internships to their students in relevant industrial and commercial organisations. This exposure eventually helps them prepare and orient for professional career.

Admission of Students

Admission of the students for the academic year 2019-20 was coordinated by DSW office. The students and scholars were admitted to undergraduate programme of five department, post graduates programme of 32 departments, M. Phil programme of 16 departments, PhD programme of 24 departments. Central admission test for the admission was conducted at nine centres located at different cities/town of India viz. Namchi, Gangtok, Siliguri, Guwahati, Darjeeling, Kalimpong, Geyzing, Kolkata and Patna. Out of to 4215 applicant, 4030 candidates were found eligible for writing the CAT [Central Admission Test] and MPhil/PhD written Test. At the end of the admission process, 946 students/scholars were admitted against the intake capacity of 1024 i,e., 92.382 % seats were filled up. Admission of female candidates (54. 86%) outnumbered the male candidates (45.13%). A total of 185 [101 male and 84 female] candidates were given the hostel seats during admission.

Entire admission process was carried out by working committee on admission being constituted by the University under the chairmanship of DSW, Dr. Laxuman Sharma. Other members of the committee were

DSW office coordinated the selection of students for University merit cum means scholarships for the students enrolled in different programmes. Students of Undergraduate and Post graduate programmes with an average family income of less than Rs. 60,000/- per annum and receiving no other financial assistance are eligible to apply for this scholarship. Accordingly, during 2019-20, Sikkim university awarded full fellowship of Rs 3000/- per month to 64 students. Similarly, 64 full free-ship and 69 half free-ship were awarded for the needy students. A total of 98.99% of applicants were able to secure one or the other type of scholarships.

The office handled the process for award of UGC Non-NET fellowship for M.Phil and PhD Scholars. In 2019, the office recommended total of 170 Non-NET fellowships (91 Fresh cases and 69 Renewal cases) and sought approval.

The office, besides the above mentioned specific activities have been coordinating all the activities related to students welfare including the popular fest Ramailo Sikkim.

6.2.2 : Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations:

- Planning and Development
 - The SAMARTH ERP Project from MHRD has been successfully initiated in Sikkim University under the coordination of Systems Management Section.
 - A total of 34 modules are in the process of implementation in the University including 2020 Online Admission process.
 - After successful completion of the security audit of the official website of the University, it is currently undergoing the Guidelines for Indian Government Website (GIGW) compliance testing.
- ✤ Administration
 - Management and monitoring of the official website, OFC network, LAN and Wi-Fi network, NKN NMEICT connection, EPABX systems, email services, biometric system, Online Admission and Recruitment modules, Computer AMC services, e-Tendering system, Video-Conferencing system, IT consultation & procurement works and CU Portal.
- Finance and Accounts
- Student Admission and Support
 - Online Admission System involves various steps and entities. Sikkim University (SU) is using SAMARTH portal for the admission from 2020. The SAMARTH portal is helping to automate entire process to save cost of managing the admission and smooth admission process.
 - Admission Process starts with the notification to the prospective students about the University, Course details and information regarding selection process. SU usually publish the notification in newspapers and the same is uploaded in the university's website.

- SAMARTH automates entire form filling and form fee payment process. Student can visit portal and register by entering requisite information and then proceed to make fee payment.
- In case of incomplete form, it can be kept in draft mode and can be updated after logging to the system.
- From fee can be paid using internet banking. During admission process students need to submit supporting documents (previous exam mark-sheet, certificates, leaving certificate, category certificate etc. All those documents can be uploaded in the form of soft copy. Admission team can view those documents or can download it from the system. Such approach can save lot of cost related to managing and maintaining hard copy documents related to admission process.
- Merit list is prepared by the Working Committee on Admission (WCA) members based on the entrance result, reservation category, other reservations including (Physically Handicapped, Supernumerary quota etc.).
- Admission process is time bound activity and all the deadlines need to be followed strictly. Each step and admission status is communicated to the student through university's website to reduce anxiety.
- Selected candidates can pay the admission fee and download receipt allotment letter from the portal.
- The semester fee can also be paid by the student through SAMARTH Portal
- Grievance Management System
- Grievance Management System is also under development by SAMARTH team. Once completed, it will available on the website for the benefit of the students

Internal Audit: Internal Audit Officer of the University conducts Internal Audit of the University. The observations of the Audit are issued to the concerned Departments/Officials for timely compliances. In every periodic interval, the position of the pending Audit para are reviewed by Standing Audit Committee. The files are marked to the Internal Audit Officer for pre-audits too in important cases.

The status of the Audit Para along with report of the SAC is placed before the Finance Committee for further instructions.

Statutory Audit: External Audit of Annual Accounts are conducted by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India in compliance to Section 33(1) of the Sikkim University Act. Copy of the annual accounts together with the audit report is submitted to the Central Government which is placed before both Houses of Parliament as per prescribed guidelines Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India.

Transaction Audit: The Comptroller and Auditor General of India, also conducts the transaction audit of the University. The University complies the

audit observations so issued through Standing Audit Committee and Finance Committee.

Department of Chemistry has a practice of collecting and safe disposal of Laboratory wastes produced during the experiments performed by the students and the research scholars.

Laboratory wastes are segregated and collected in the following ways:

1. Organic Waste:-

(a)**Constituents-** Organic Solvents like Petroleum Ether, Ethyl Acetate, Dichloromethane, Chloroform, Acetonitrile, Toluene, Acetone

(b)**Properties-** Low Boiling point, Flammable, Volatile

2. Aqueous Waste or Inorganic Waste:-

(a) **Constituents-** Water with different salts like Sodium Chloride, Sodium bicarbonate, Sodium Thiosulphate, Sodium Hydroxide

(b) **Properties**- Corrosive

- 3. Acid Waste:-
 - (a) **Constituent**s-Hydrochloric Acid, Sulphuric Acid, Acetic Acid, Nitric acid

Properties-Corrosive, highly miscible in water

Teaching – Learning Process

- Sikkim University releases academic calendar in the beginning of every academic calendar for planning stipulated academic commitments the same is uploaded in the university website for reference.
- Sound ICT provisions are made available in all the 112 classrooms of the 32departments for motivating members in the faculty use ICT tool for conduct of the classes.
- Every teacher is mandated to strictly maintain attendance record of the students and in situation irregularity is observed the same is notified to the departmental heads for necessary action.
- Periodic tests and assignment work are scheduled for assessment of student's involvement in academic.
- Syllabus coverage is monitored by the departmental heads in regular intervals.
- Syllabus for various courses undergo periodic reviews to keep up with the discipline specific requirement and evolving trends, the same is uploaded in the university website for reference.

Mentoring System for Students

- Students enrolled under various programmes like UG, PG, MPhil and PhD across various departments in the university are directly placed under the guidance and supervision of the departmental faculty members. The faculty members guides students in their minor dissertations, major dissertation, internships and field trips.
- During their minor dissertations and major dissertation the students perform their routine assignments apportioned by their respective mentors

and are rigorously assessed for performance during the tenure of the dissertation.

7.3 Institutional Distinctiveness

One of the prime objectives of the university is to achieve intellectual, academic and cultural development of the people of Eastern Himalayas.

In pursuit of the same, our university has so far established 32 academic departments spread across 6 schools of studies, namely the School of Human Sciences, School of Languages and Literature, School of Life Sciences, School of Physical Sciences, School of Professional Studies and School of Social Sciences. The university has around 160 members in the faculty of various departments and 2700 students from all over India and overseas enrolled in various programmes such as UG, PG, M Phil and PhD offered by different departments. In an academic year, around 900 students graduate from the university. In addition to this, the university also produces around 80 M Phil and 70 PhD candidates.

To keep the curriculum framework on track and at par with other academic institutes of eminence, periodic curriculum revisions are made inviting experts from prominent academic institutions, industries, practitioners, civil society and non-profit agencies. The curriculum revisions are made keeping in view the recent trends, needs of the future and prospective opportunities. The curriculum also pays due regard to the requirements of the locality and the local community. In fact Sikkim University is the only university in the world which offers post-graduate courses in Bhutia, Lepcha and Limboo languages. Our university has granted affiliation to 18 colleges in the state of Sikkim. The university carries out the responsibilities of curriculum drafting, managing examinations and other academic affairs of these colleges. In addition to teaching-learning activities, the faculty members of the university are engaged in diverse fields of research. This is evident from the number of annual publications and projects awarded to members of the faculty by different governmental and non-governmental agencies. The List includes UGC, ICSSR, CEPF, JICA, DST, NMHS, GBPNIHED, DBT, SERB, ICMR, DST-Inspire, NMSHE, UNU-WIDER, ICHR, INSA, NERC-ICSSR, NEC, ICRIER, ICIMOD-HUC and Kendriya Hindi Sansthan.

The Scopus and WOS database lists around 330 and 280 articles respectively published by the members of faculty in the university. The number of publications in various refereed journals averages around 200 articles per year. The members of the faculty also do publish books and book chapters averaging over 70 publications. Currently, the faculty members from the university are engaged in around 50 ongoing projects inviting experts, JRF, SRF and Scholars from their respective fields.

The academic departments host various seminars, conferences, and workshops inviting experts from all around the globe throughout the year for knowledge exchange, student enrichment and mutual prosperity. The departments altogether organize around 50 such events annually.

Besides academics, the university also promotes students to actively participate in sports and cultural events at the regional, state and national level. SUSA the student's body, SUTA the teacher's body and SUNTA the staff body of the university are actively engaged in executing various activities of academic and social importance.

The university is equally committed to societal responsibilities, through Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA), Government of India. Sikkim University has adopted five villages in Yangang- Rangang GPU, South Sikkim. The UBA cell of Sikkim University till now has organized two Orientation programmes at Rangang -Yangang GPU.

The university is thus relentlessly striving to achieve its proposed vision.

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
