faculty members.





National Technology Day

Sikkim University organised a day long event on the occasion of National Technology Day at Chintan Bhawan Gangtok on 11th May 2019. The Chief Guest for the programme was the Honourable Governor of Sikkim Shri Ganga Prasad. The Honourable Governor in his address appreciated the initiative of the University in celebrating National Technology Day and expressed his hope that such initiative of the University would inculcate the scientific temperament in young generation and encourage students in science and technology. He also stressed upon the need to inculcate the culture of science and technology among the people of Sikkim.

On the occasion three lecture sessions were organised which were delivered by Prof. Parthasarathi Mukhopadayay on ancient Indian Mathematics and the importance of Zero, Prof. R.R. Navalgund who spoke on Space Research and Prof. Rakesh Tuli who spoke on Biochemistry and genetically modified crops and the reconstruction of tissues and organs. The three eminent speakers gave an insight into the progress that science has made in different fields such as mathematics, space research and agriculture.

The students from different schools of Gangtok participated in a quiz competition that was organised later in the day. The students from different colleges and the different departments of the University participated in a debate competition.
